MINUTE FOR MISSION - TRUE NORTH AID

True North Aid was started in 2009 to answer the challenging needs of our Indigenous communities much before crisis situations in the north drew national attention. As a Canadian registered charity, their mandate is to provide practical humanitarian assistance through initiatives established on eight foundational stones of support. There are many areas in which True North Aid is working. I would like to give you a sampling of their activities in 3 of the foundational stones.

Reconciliation Hockey Cares is a cultural exchange program created to foster positive relationships between Indigenous and non-Indigenous youth in Canada. Through a shared love of hockey, the program provides youth with the opportunity to play hockey, create friendships and experience life in a new community. The 2023 Hockey Cares Program will include youth from Oakville and Attawapiskat.

Housing – True North Aid is proud to support various Community-Led Initiatives across the country focused on housing and providing furniture to homes across the north, including the Good Night's Sleep Campaign, which provides mattresses and bedding and the Furniture for First Nations in Treaty #3. Other projects include partnerships with One House Many Nations and helping to build "tiny homes" for at-risk youth experiencing homelessness.

Education – True North Aid is supporting education by providing school supplies, educational opportunities and literacy support to remote communities across the country through initiatives like "Back to School," which provides backpacks of school supplies and Norther Reads programs which ship books to remote communities.

It is always a challenge for your Outreach Team to choose worthy charities to which we donate on your behalf. The wide and innovative programs offered by True North Aid make this one of our easier decisions.
