Your neighbourhood conservation authority, Conservation Halton, works to protect, restore and manage natural resources in your watershed from lake to escarpment. Our vision is to sustain a healthy watershed with clean streams, vigorous forests, abundant green space and balanced growth that results in strong livable communities.

Spanning 1,000 Sq. Km of land, 17 flowing creeks, approx. 26 km of Lake Ontario shoreline, extensive forest cover and 80 Km of Ontario's Niagara Escarpment, our mandate is to create avenues for sustainable synergy between the natural world we live in and the 450,000 residents that make up the Halton watershed.

Areas of focus: Water & Forest Resources Management and Lifelong Education and Recreation Help the Conservation Halton Foundation make a difference daily. Help by planting trees for the love of nature. Help by sponsoring the protection of precious wildlife. Help by teaching children about the impact they can make in affecting change. The Conservation Halton Foundation raises funds for stewardship and education about our natural environment. Since 1976, we've raised more than \$6,700,000 for environmental projects in Halton. These funds helped to complete more than 25 projects, from teaching more than 150,000 students about nature, to planting thousands of trees, to caring for hundreds of injured birds of prey.

OCEANA CANADA – Protecting The World's Oceans

Oceana Canada, an independent charity established to restore Canadian oceans to be as rich, healthy, and abundant as they once were, is proud to be affiliated with the international family of Oceana organizations.

Oceana, Inc., founded in 2001, is the largest international organization focused solely on ocean conservation. Oceana organizations work in their home regions to educate the public about ocean conservation issues and to raise the profile of ocean conservation with decision-makers.

Canada has the world's longest coastline and is responsible for 2.76 million square kilometers of ocean. This real estate makes Canada one of the world's major fishing nations, catching 1.1 million metric tonnes of fish each year, or 1.6 per cent of the world's wild fish catch by weight, and consistently ranking within the top 25 fish-producing countries in the world. But even with these high yields, Canadian fisheries are performing below their full potential.

Fortunately, we know how to fix things. Science-based fishery management — which establishes science-based catch limits, reduces bycatch and protects habitat — is helping the oceans rebound and recover where it is established. Oceana Canada will work with civil society, academics, fishers, and government to return Canada's formerly vibrant oceans to health.
